Standards of Learning (SOL) Spring 2025 Test Administration

Standards of Learning (SOL) Assessment is the statewide test that is given to all 3rd-5th grade students. The SOL is a standardized test administered in Virginia public schools to measure how well students are meeting the state's academic expectations in subjects like English, math, science, and history/social science at the end of each grade level or course; essentially, it's a way to gauge student proficiency based on the Virginia curriculum standards. The SOL test administration window opens mid-March, below is our SOL testing schedule. Please review and ensure that you schedule any appointments, trips, etc. around this schedule. We need students to be in school every day, get a good night's sleep every night, and are focused and on task.

PWCS has made changes to their policy of when parents/guardians need to inform the school of any student transportation changes. Parents/guardians must call the front office at 703-441-0050 by 2:00pm to make transportation changes. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Communication

Effective communication is important for the home-school connection. When contacting a staff member please be aware that staff have 24 - 48 hours (Mon.- Fri.) to respond to all messages (phone, School Status, email). When messages are sent after 4:00pm Mon.,- Fri., the 24 - 48 hour times starts the next business day. If there is an emergency, please contact the front office. During the school day staff members are engaged with students and are not always available to receive or respond to messages.

Informational Items:

- School Hours 8:45AM-3:25 PM. Tardy Bell rings at 8:45AM.
- Office Hours- 8:00AM- 4:00PM.
- Doors open for student entry at 8:30am, so please do not drop off your children before 8:30AM.
- A parent or guardian must accompany and sign in children arriving at school after 8:45AM.
- If you need to pick up your children during school hours, you must present a Government Issued Photo Identification Card and sign them out from the office. The office staff will call for the children to meet you in the office after your arrival and check out. The purpose of this procedure is to reduce disruptions to classroom instruction, as well as for safety reasons.
- All dismissal changes must be made in writing before 2:00PM. If you are picking up students for early dismissal, you must pick them up by 2:30PM. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
